



FY 2020 Omnibus Appropriations Bill Released; \$10M Increase for Title V

The House and Senate have reached an agreement to fund the federal government for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2020. The text can be found [here](#) and report language for the Labor, Health and Human Services and Education (Labor-HHS) bill can be found [here](#).

Total funding for for the Title V Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant is at \$687,700,000 representing a \$10 million increase over FY 2019 levels. From our initial reading, the \$10 million increase is allocated as follows:

- \$2 million - Alliance on Innovation for Maternal Health (AIM) for a total of \$5 million
- \$7 million - Infant Toddler Courts for a total of \$10 million (as you may recall this program was transferred to be funded through Title V last year)
- \$523,000 – SPRANS set-aside for Fetal Alcohol Syndrome
- \$477,000 – For state formula grants
