

THE SHORT LIST - OVERVIEW

State teams selected, through a nominal group process, 13 indicators from the set of 59 that they felt best captured the breadth and robustness of the final set. Users can start by calculating these indicators, and programs can use this set to communicate with policymakers and stakeholders outside of the MCH program.

Indicator
1. Adverse childhood experiences among children (NSCH)
2. Experiences of race-based discrimination among pregnant women (PRAMS)
3. Experiences of discrimination among children (NSCH)
4. Households with a high level of concentrated disadvantage (ACS)
5. Children living in households where smoking occurs inside the home (NSCH)
6. Children or adults who are currently overweight or obese (NSCH, YRBSS, BRFSS, PRAMS)
7. Depression among youth (YRBSS)
8. Household food insecurity (USDA ERS)
9. Preterm births (NVSS)
10. Stressors during pregnancy (PRAMS)
11. Incarceration rate (BOJ, NPSP)
12. Children who receive services in a medical home (NSCH)
13. 4 th graders scoring proficient or above on math and reading (NAEP)
