prematurity and infant mortality. This effort will assess the current initiatives in the Northeast public health region, reveal the potential service gaps, and result in recommendations to address needs for our most vulnerable populations. Facilitated discussion will be focused on identifying program options and actionable strategies aimed at aligning efforts, mapping assets, and developing a comprehensive action plan, which will serve as a model process for future planning across Kansas.
